1. STORMWATER ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

Ordinance Amending the current Township Stormwater Management Ordinance requiring fences around all detention and infiltration ponds having the potential for standing water 3 foot or greater in depth. See Ordinance prepared by Manager/Engineer and reviewed by Solicitor Hancher.

2. TAR&CHIP PROJECT REBID
