

**CLINTON TOWNSHIP
ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 03**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CLINTON, BUTLER COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT ON A PORTION OF
BREWER ROAD (T# 554) OF 25 MILES PER HOUR**

WHEREAS, the Second Class Township Code (53 P.S. § 66527) authorizes the Board of Supervisors of Second Class Townships to adopt ordinances to secure the safety of persons or property within the township; and

WHEREAS, the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code provides that establishing speed limits pursuant to subchapter F of Chapter 33 of the Vehicle Code is presumed to be a reasonable exercise of police power by local authorities (75 Pa.C.S. §6109(a)(10)); and

WHEREAS, the Vehicle Code provides that local authorities may exercise the powers granted in the Code only by duly enacted ordinances of their governing bodies (75 Pa.C.S. § 6102(b)); and

WHEREAS, the Vehicle Code authorizes local authorities on highways under their jurisdiction to establish reasonable and safe maximum speed limits (75 Pa.C.S. § 3362(a)(1.2); § 3363); and

WHEREAS, the Township desires to establish a speed limit of twenty-five miles per hour for a portion of Brewer Road (T# 554), as defined below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Clinton, Butler County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to the authority as described above, that Section 166-4(A) of Chapter 166 of the Code of the Township of Clinton be amended as follows:

**SECTION 1. MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT OF 25 M.P.H. ESTABLISHED
ON A PORTION OF BREWER ROAD**

The maximum speed limit for that portion of Brewer Road running from Saxonburg Boulevard to the north side of the railroad tracks is established at twenty-five miles per hour (25 M.P.H.).

SECTION 2. NOTICE AND POSTING OF SPEED LIMIT SIGNS

After the effective date of this Ordinance, the Township shall post Brewer Road with official traffic control devices (speed limit signs) erected in accordance with the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S. § 3362(b)) and applicable regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and in the event that any provision is held invalid, void, illegal, or unconstitutional by any Court, it is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that such determination by the Court shall not affect or render void the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is the declared intent of the Board of Supervisors that this Ordinance would have been enacted if any provision subsequently declared to be void, invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional had not been included at the time of enactment.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after the date of its enactment.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE CLINTON TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, this _____ day of _____, 2023, that the preceding shall be enacted as part of the Code of the Township of Clinton.
